The aim of EQUASP project is the definition and implementation of an online documentation and monitoring system for the quality assurance (QA) of study programmes (SPs) in the Russian Federation, consistent with the European Standards and Guidelines for Quality Assurance, in order to promote their quality, transparency and comparability at national and international level.

The first steps of the project have regarded the definition of the EQUASP Standards and Guidelines for internal QA of SPs and of the questionnaires for the monitoring of the SPs' quality perceived by stakeholders. The results of these activities have been gathered in the documents "EQUASP Standards and Guidelines for internal Quality Assurance of Study Programmes (EQUASP Model)" and "EQUASP Questionnaires for the monitoring of the perceived quality of study programmes", approved by the by the Project Board in the Moscow meeting on 11 March 2015 and available on the project web site at http://equasp.tstu.ru/documents.php.

Then each Partner University has defined its organization and responsibilities for the documentation of the QA of SPs. The Project Board has taken note of the organization and responsibilities of the Partner Universities in the Tambov meeting on 14 October 2015. Contextually, the software for the online documentation of the QA of SPs and for the on-line monitoring of the SPs' quality perceived by stakeholders have been designed and produced.

The main aim of the Rome Training Seminar will be the introduction and training of the Partner Universities to the implementation and use of the software for the on-line documentation of the QA of SPs and for the on-line monitoring of the SPs' quality perceived by stakeholders.

Traditionally founded in 753 BC by Romulus and Remus, Rome began its great development beginning from the $10^{\rm th}$ century BC till it became first a Republic and then the centre of a great empire, the Roman Empire.

Rome contains an exceptional artistic patrimony, glorious heritage to its great past. Besides the imposing rests of its magnificent history throughout all the period of the Roman Empire and Renaissance with the pieces of Raphael, Michelangelo, among the most famous artists.

The works of the architects Borromini and Bernini, masters of the Baroque, left an indelible and representative sign to the city, embellished by a great numbers of palaces, villas, and fountains.

Many works of art by the greatest artists of Italy and of the world are gathered in the famous museums of the city and in its churches, and in the Vatican.

Rome is also the Italian centre of dramatic arts and cinema: the famous *Cinecittà*, the "Italian Hollywood", is the prestigious set of many glorious national and international movies such as *Ben Hur* by William Wyler (1959), *I Vitelloni* by Federico Fellini (1953), *The English patient* by Anthony Minghella (1996) and *Gangs of New York* by Martin Scorsese (2002), among others.

HOW TO REACH THE ROMA CITY CENTER FROM THE AIRPORT ("FIUMICINO – LEONARDO DA VINCI")

From Fiumicino airport, you can take a taxi, or a train, or the Shuttle Bus to reach the center of Rome.

Taxi

Taxi station is outside the airport's arrival (Terminal 1, 2, 3, and 5). Prices vary from € 48 to € 55, depending the final destination: please refer to http://www.adr.it/web/aeroporti-di-roma-en-/pax-fco-taxi

Taxi is eligible if used by at least three people. Please collect receipt mentioning itinerary.

Train

There is a railway station (FS –Trenitalia) within the airport. There are two railway lines:

- <u>Leonardo Express</u> direct to Termini Station, every 30 minutes. It takes approximately 30 min. Ticket price is € 14.
- **Sabina-Fiumicino line (FR1)** leaving from Fiumicino railway station to Rome, every 20 minutes about. It stops in some of the main Roman railway stations (Trastevere, Tiburtina, Tuscolana, Ostiense); the most relevant one is Trastevere. Ticket price is € 8.
- Both the costs for Leonardo Express and Sabina-Fiumicino are eligible.

Bus Shuttle (http://www.sitbusshuttle.com/en)

Shuttle Buses are at the BUS Station adjacent to the exits from Terminal 3–Arrivals. The bus stops in Rome at Termini Station (via Marsala) and Vaticano (Via Crescenzio). The service is active every day from Monday to Sunday and tickets can be purchased on-line or on the bus. The journey takes approximately 55 min. and the buses run approximately every half hour. Ticket price is € 6. Timetable: http://www.sitbusshuttle.com/en/timetable/.

Be aware that the bust shuttles are very often stuck in **traffic jam**.


HOW TO REACH CRUI'S HEADQUARTER FROM TERMINI RAILWAY STATION

At the station take bus number either 40 or 64 and get off in Piazza di Torre Argentina. From there, beside La Feltrinelli bookstore, walk all the way down Via di Torre Argentina till it becomes Via della Rotonda, Piazza della Rotonda and eventually Via della Rosetta. Once you reach the end of the latter, turn left on Via delle Colonnelle. Half way through it you will find Piazza Rondanini. CRUI's headquarter is located at number 48, floor 1.

HOW TO REACH CRUI'S HEADQUARTER FROM TRASTEVERE RAILWAY STATION

At the station take the tram n. 8 and get off at "Venezia" stop; from here take Via degli Astalli, turn left in Via di Piè di Marmo, pass by the Minerva's obelisk (on your right) and the Pantheon (on your left), turn left in Piazza della Rotonda, walk up until Via della Rosetta, turn left in Via del pozzo delle cornacchie. Piazza Rondanini is on your left.

On foot, the most suggested reference point is **Largo di Torre Argentina**: here below you can find the map with three possible routes from Largo di Torre Argentina to Piazza Rondanini, 48.
